#### Wilde's works

- As regards his poetics, in 1881 he published his first volume of poems and his most famous novel is "The picture of Dorian Grey".
- In this novel he deals with the theme of Aesthetic movement, where the main character, Dorian Grey, is fascinated by his own beauty when an artist gave him his portrait, so much that he expresses a wish that the portrait would absorb all the sign of age while he will remain forever in his youthful perfection.
- While the top of Oscar Wilde success were his comdies.
- During his two years in prison he wrote his confession De profundis.





Lord Alfred Bruce Douglas, nicknamed "Bosie" (1870 - 1945), was a poet, writer and translator.

#### The Wilde scandal

- His popularity declined in 1895 when he was imprisoned for homosexual offences.
- Douglas met Oscar Wilde in 1891.
   When Douglas's father, the
   Marquess of Queensberry
   discovered the relationship of the
   child, publicly he insulted Wilde
   with ungrammatical note left at
   the club of Dublin writer.
- The ticket, which was a business card, was inscribed: "To Oscar Wilde posing as a somdomita".
- Wilde was sentenced to two years in prison and forced labor.
- After his relase in 1897, he emigrated to France, where he died 3 years later, a result of a life of poverty and sadness.
